SIR MALCOLM STODDART-SCOTT

Most members of The Chippendale Society will already have learned, with regret, that Sir Malcolm Stoddart-Scott, first President of the Society, died on June 15th 1973, after a brief illness.

Many have paid tribute to his achievements as physician, soldier, countryman and politician, the one to whom others instinctively turned for the help that was always forthcoming.

To The Chippendale Society, in which he was deeply interested, he brought his own combination of charm, warmth and the drive and know-how of the politician, without which the Society could not have attained its present status and respect. He had already indicated that he would not seek re-election to Parliament, and was looking forward to having more time to give to the affairs of the Society, and the planning of its Museum.

PRESIDENCY

Lady Stoddart-Scott, who throughout had been closely associated with her husband's work for the Society, graciously accepted Councils' invitation to fulfil the duties of President until the next Annual General Meeting in 1974.

NORTHERN ANTIQUE DEALERS! FAIR: HARROGATE SEPT, 1973 Sir Malcolm was to have opened the Northern Antique Dealers' Fair at Harrogate on September 6th. Lady Stoddart-Scott accepted the organisers' invitation to take his place. At the close of the ceremony, they presented a cheque for £150, through her, to the Society's property fund, and gave for the Museum an interesting volume of 'fraudulent Chippendale designs', published in London in 1834, entitled "A Collection of Ornamental Designs after Chippendale", which reproduces rococo engravings by Matthias Lock. The Society is indebted to the organisers of the Northern Antique Dealers' Fair for these generous gifts, for facilities to bring the Society to the notice of visitors to the Fair, and for arranging a Reception at the Crown Hotel, Harrogate, at which Mr. Christopher Gilbert, M. A., Keeper of Temple Newsam House, Leeds, gave a particularly interesting, informative and beautifully illustrated lecture about Chippendale in the North.

YORK MINSTER GLASS AND SILVER On September 29th, a number of Members of the Society accompanied Mr. Peter Gibson around much of the stained glass at York Minster, and once more were enthralled and delighted by his vivid descriptions of the history and care of the windows over many centuries. Some of the Members took the opportunity to visit the unique collection of York silver loaned to the Minster by Mr. William Lee of York, a fellow Member of the Society.

AUTUMN LECTURE: NOV. 7th. 8p. m. CIVIC CENTRE OTLEY Mr. Christopher Hutchinson, B. A., Lecturer in Fine and Decorative Arts at Leeds Polytechnic, and a Member of the Chippendale Society, will speak on "YORKSHIRF FURNITURF", a subject of considerable personal resarch. This illustrated lecture is likely to be of particular interest both to those whose first love is furniture, and to industrial historians.

JOINT CONFERENCE APRIL 26-28th, 1974. A Weekend Conference is being organised jointly by the Chippendale and Furniture History Societies, to be based at the Post House, Bramhope, Leeds, next April.

A stimulating programme, including lectures relating to Chippendale, visits to outstanding country-house collections containing examples of his work, and social events, has been arranged.
