Joint Exhibition with Otley Arts Club. 2nd to 9th. June. This exhibition, which was part of the Bicentenery celebrations, was opened by the Deputy Lord Mayor of Leeds, Councillor R.A. Latest Acquisition. A parlour chair, mahogany c.1762-5, Maker unknown. The design of the back corresponds to Plate 14 in the 3rd. Edition of Chippendale's <u>Director</u>. It comes from the only recorded set of dining chairs based on this engraving. Four companion chairs were recently sold to French & Co., New York and this chair was purchased by the Chippendal Society in April 1979 with the aid of a contribution from Sam Chippindale, a 50% government grant and help from the Pelham Galleries, London.
