ANNUAL EXCURSION. SATURDAY 21st JUNE 1980 to ROKEBY PARK, BOWES MUSEUM, Barnard Castle, and the GEORGIAN THEATRE, Richmond.

Rokeby Hall, which is not normally open to the public, was built by Sir Thomas
Robinson during the first half of the eighteenth century. This is an attractive
Palladian style house with an unusual ochre coloured front and with a number of
fine interior features. Members will find many interesting items of furniture.

Nearby is the Bowes Museum, where we shall spend the afternoon. This grand building,

in beautiful grounds, has been described as "perhaps the best example in Britain of the Second Empire Style". It houses a magnificent collection of furniture (English period rooms and French 18th and 19th century furniture); English and Continental pottery and porcelain; textiles, tapestries and embroideries and masterpieces by Goya, El Greco, Tiepolo and Primaticcio. We shall be making a short visit to the Georgian Theatre, Richmond, before taking afternoon tea at the King's Head Hotel, Richmond. The coach will arrive back in Otley between 7.00 pm and 7.30 pm.
