#### Recent Acquisition

In May the Society seized the opportunity to purchase a very rare scrap book album compiled in 1757. It contains clippings from furniture pattern books issued by Chippendale's great rival Matthias Lock, ornamental engravings by Vivares and Collins, several manuscript and designs, title pages, trade cards and other ephemera. Such anthologies of fashionable decoration are exceedingly rare - the Gideon Saint Scrap book at the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York, comes to mind - and it is most satisfying to have acquired so reasonably this important document of taste. Much research will need to be done on its precise function and ancestry, but it appears to have descended in a north country branch of the Boydell family who published suites of mid-18th century engraved ornament. We bought it at an auction in Chester for £146 the money being donated by Raymond Burton and Herbert Heidelberger. The Society is deeply grateful to these private benefactors for their magnificent support.

# Denton Hall - Application Form

Members attending this function from the Otley, Leeds area should cross the bridge in Otley taking the first road to the left signposted Askwith/Denton. This is the back road to Ilkley, proceed through Askwith then in approx. 2/3 miles turn right sign posted Denton. The entrance to the Hall is  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile on the right with parking areas clearly signposted. A one way system operates in the grounds but the entrance to the Hall is at the front of the building. Members from Bradford, Menston area take the main Ilkley road turning right over the iron bridge just past the Ben Rhydding Sports Ground. Then right along the road signposted Middleton/Denton, then in  $\frac{3}{4}$  mile turn left signposted Denton.
