TWO MAJOR NEW ACQUISITIONS

In April the Society was very fortunate to be offered two magnificent pieces of furniture which Thomas Chippendale made for David Garrick's villa on the Thames at Hampton in 1770. A dwarf book case painted ivory with dainty chinoiserie decoration in green commissioned for the famous actors own bedroom and a half round pier table originally painted green and white from the drawing room, one of a pair for which Chippendale charged £10.0.0 with '2 Green Cloth Covers to do' costing 15/-. They were acquired by William Hardman in 1864 and passed by direct descent to the vendor. The Society is profoundly grateful to the Sam Chippindale Foundation in particular for contributing half the purchase price of these two items which together cost £3,000; the other half was financed by a government grant. It is extremely satisfying to have acquired two items displaying such a unique artistic personality. The table as at some time been painted white all over, but the old surface remains beneath the later finish and can be revealed by dry stripping. These two pieces could have gone straight into any museum in the world. The dwarf book shelves will be on display at the Annual Dinner.

LOANS TO THE ROCOCO EXHIBITION

The Society has lent the following articles from its collection to the international exhibition Rococo: Art and Design in Hogarth's England being held at the Victoria and Albert Museum, London 16 May - 30 September. Engraved inscription tablet and a handle from the coffin which Chippendale supplied for the funeral of Lady Bridget Heathcote in 1772; Chippendale's manuscript design of three chairs for plate 12 of the Director, 1754; loose engraved plate from the Director; scrap book of engravings for ornament, 1757; invitation ticket, c.1755 engraved by M. Darly from a drawing by Thomas Chippendale.
