MORE CHIPPENDALE FURNITURE SOLD FROM HAREWOOD HOUSE

It will be recalled that in April 1986 Lord Harewood sold at Christie's 14 lots of furniture including several pairs of spectacular carved and gilt or silvered looking glasses. Following the sale the Society purchased from an American dealer an exotic oval panel of hand painted Oriental wallpaper in a timber and papier mache frame. On 25 June 1987 a further group of five richly styled mirrors and a pair of curved sofa stools made by Chippendale for Harewood House appeared at Christie's. it is sad to witness the dispersal of this pre-eminent collection of Chippendale furniture. A marquetry horseshoeshaped table form Burton Constable near Hull also featured in the sale - but this failed to reach its reserve and was bought in at £85,000.

RESTORATION GRANTS

The oval collage of hand painted oriental paper has now been expertly cleaned and conserved. The papier mache and wood frame surrounding the panel is currently being restored by Wiggins & Son of London who are making moulds to recast the gadrooned border decoration in papier mache. A missing cresting ornament will be recarved incorporating a fronded anthemion from a dismantled frame in store at Harewood. We are grateful to his Lordship for the gift of this element. The programme of restoration has been fully funded by an anonymous gift of £2,500 from one of our members.

The second restoration project concerns refinishing a tripod firescreen stand acquired in 1982 in its original blue and gold livery. This will be undertaken by Peter and Anne McTaggart at a cost of about £4,000. We have been exceedingly fortunate in attracting four grants to cover the cost of this work. The Sam Chippindale Foundation have contributed £1,000, the Pilgrim Trust gave £1,500, the Sir George Martin Trust donated £750 and Leeds City Council have subscribed £750. We are infinitely grateful to these organisations for their magnificent support which will enable us to commission a first rate job without any skimping - as befits a Society who are custodians of these masterpieces of English furniture.

CHIPPENDALE TAPESTRY

We hope that in the near future the famous Readicut Wool Company will produce a reproduction tapestry in kit form of the Society's tapestry panel to enable those interested in needlework to embroider a version of this historic tapestry for themselves. More details will be given if and when they become available.

THE CHIPPENDALE DINNER

120 guests were greeted by the Society's President, Lady Elsie Stoddart-Scott, and newly elected Chairman Mrs Mary Gilbert. The principle guest, Mrs Robin Compton, outlined the history and renovation work undertaken at Newby Hall. Mr Andrew Firth, who had recently retired as Chairman of the Society, was presented with a magnificent lectern. Mr Firth was thanked for his hard work and devotion to the Society and the Chairman presented him with a small gift on behalf of the Society.
